



Team Policies

Students on our team are expected to respect their classmates, themselves, their teachers, and the school property at all times. The 6th grade teachers have very high academic expectations as well as behavioral expectations reflected by the pillars of character education.

Classroom Rules and Expectations:

1. Be respectful.
 - Respect the school, students, teachers, staff, yourself, and your materials.
 - Raise your hand to speak or to get out of your seat.
2. Be responsible.
 - Follow directions the first time given
 - Complete assignments
 - Bring necessary materials
3. Be ready.
 - Be in your seat and ready to start when the bell rings.
 - Do your best each day.

Consequences:

1. Verbal Warning—given when small infractions occur
2. Hallway Conference—to discuss behavior
3. Rules Sheet/Parent Contact—to be completed and signed by both the student and a parent
4. Office Referral/Removal from classroom—results from extreme situations or repetitive infractions

Late Work:

Late work is anything that is not completed when the student walks into the door of the classroom. The policy is left up to the discretion of the teacher, but the guidelines are as follows:

- Credit Check/Completion Check/Small Grade (5-10 points)—no late grades allowed, automatic zero
- Daily Work Late Grade Policy—
 - 1 "oops" per quarter per subject
 - 1 day late = 50% off

- If the assignment is not turned in after 1 day, it will be a zero.
- Limit 3 "late grades" per quarter per subject
- After 3 late grades per subject during a quarter, the student will receive an office referral. The office referral may result in an after school detention.

Academic Dishonesty:

Academic dishonesty is taken very seriously. Any kind of cheating will not be tolerated and will result in an automatic zero for the assignment or test as well as a referral to the office where the student will be subject to additional disciplinary action from the administration.

Study Hall/Advisory Period:

All students will have a study hall Monday thru Thursday. Fridays will be set-aside for an advisory period. The following guidelines apply:

1. Study hall is a time for students to productively work on school projects and assignments.
2. Students must arrive to study hall/advisory on time and be prepared. The advisory teacher will give no locker passes.
3. Students must use study hall time to work on assignments, ask for help from team teachers, or work together on group/partner project (only if given permission from the study hall/advisory teacher).
4. Advisory is a time for students to participate in team building and character education activities.

Student Agendas:

Your child will receive an agenda to use throughout the school year. WJHS students must present their agenda to the teacher to receive a pass to leave the room and should carry it with them throughout the day. We encourage our team members to keep track of all homework assignments and class work in the space provided for each day of the school year. Students and parents are responsible for reading the handbook provided at the beginning of the agenda, which contains important school and district information and policies. Please sign the front of the agenda, indicating you have read and understand the policies. Students are expected to treat their agenda as a textbook, keeping it in good shape and using it throughout the entire year. Replacements are available in the office for \$6 each.
